SO MIGHTILY GREW THE WORD OF GOD - PART 1

Acts 19:8-20 | Pastor T. H. Moore

n our text this week, Paul's ministry in the city of Ephesus Lis continuing. In the first seven verses of Acts 19, Paul had returned to the city of Ephesus and met twelve men that I believe had a deficient knowledge of Jesus Christ for salvation. He told these twelve men that they ... should believe on him which should come after him, that is, on Christ Jesus." These men then got saved and scripturally baptizedbut God was not finished with the people in Ephesus, and from Acts 19:8 to 19:20, we read of a great revival that took place in that city. This revival could be summed up by the phrase that we find in verse 20, which reads, "So mightily grew the word of God and prevailed." The word "prevailed" means, "to overcome; to gain the victory or superiority; to be in force; to gain or have predominant influence." This is what the Word of God did in Ephesus.

There have been many times in the history of our nation where the Word of God mightily grew and prevailed. One such time was in December of 1827 under the preaching of Charles Finney when he was invited to Wilmington, Delaware, to preach. Finney held great meetings where it was said that "God sent revival blessing." He went on to Philadelphia and upstate New York where he preached to thousands of people. Many souls were saved and there was a great moral change in the entire northeast section of America. It is said that over 500,000 people were saved under his preaching. I believe it would be accurate to say that "the Word of God grew mightily and prevailed."

As we look at our text over the next few weeks, we will look at three reasons why the Word of God grew mightily and prevailed in Ephesus. Let's look this week at the first reason:

I. Paul's Discernment (vs. 8-9)

We read in verses eight and nine, "And he went into the synagogue, and spake boldly for the space of three months, disputing and persuading the things concerning the kingdom of God. But when divers were hardened, and believed not, but spake evil of that way before the multitude, he departed from them, and separated the disciples,

disputing daily in the school of one Tyrannus." We read here how the apostle Paul, as he so frequently did, entered into the synagogue at Ephesus, and for three months, he "spake boldly" and "disputed" and "persuaded" the things concerning the kingdom of God. Let's look at each of these words. The word "disputed" means, "the action of pulling something into pieces and considering all the parts." In other words, Paul took all the parts of the Bible, comparing Scripture with Scripture, and showed them that Jesus Christ is the promised Messiah. He was thorough in his use of the Word of God. Then, the word "persuaded" means, "to convince by an argument and

evidence." Paul did this boldly!

Every Christian should be able to, or at least be working at being able to, take our Bibles and give a logical, biblical answer for what we believe.

While Paul was there in the synagogue for three months, he once again met with contention. The "divers" were unbelievers who attempted to draw people away from the truth, but when Paul felt that he couldn't get any further with some of the unbelievers, we read that he separated the disciples and departed from them. He brought them to a rented hall called "the school of one Tyrannus." Paul felt that the time had come for him to leave those unbelievers to themselves, to their own choices.

There is a lesson here for all of us. I am not one to suggest ever giving up on people, or stop praying for people—but there *are times* when we have said all that we can say, done all that we can do for the time, and given all the biblical advice that we can give—and all that we can do is leave people to their choices.

When Charles Finney was describing what a revival is in his book Lectures on Revival, he said this: "A revival always includes conviction of sin. Backslidden professors cannot wake up and begin right away in the service of God, without deep searching of the heart. The fountains of sin need to be broken up." Sometimes, some people do not want to listen, and have no interest in the things of God. We must not waste our time on those who are obviously not interested in the things of God, but instead, invest our time in those who truly do want to listen!
