

YOUTH CAMP CODE OF CONDUCT

GENERAL INFORMATION

The standards we have are Biblically based and will be upheld by all campers and visitors. Knowing these policies before you come to our camp will help you decide whether this is the place for you to attend or send your young people. Following these rules while at the campground will help you to have a more enjoyable visit. Please read them carefully.

ALL CAMPERS CODE OF CONDUCT

Campers are not to bring alcoholic beverages, tobacco in any form, radios, multimedia devices, computers, cell phones, books or magazines, knives, guns, or weapons of any kind. No video games, fireworks, or pets. Shirts with questionable pictures or emblems are also not allowed. Mixed swimming is not permitted. No medication is to be kept by the campers. All medication will be turned in to the camp director upon arrival. No physical contact is allowed between male and female campers. All visitors must be pre-approved by the camp director. All campers must participate in all camp activities unless the camper has a valid excuse. This determination will be made by the camp director. Any camper failing to comply with the camp rules may be sent home. In the event that a camper is sent home it will be at the individual's or their church's expense. In the event that a camper must drive a personal vehicle to camp, the keys must be turned into the camp director upon the camper's arrival.

LADIES' CODE OF CONDUCT

Ladies are required to wear modest skirts and "skirt-appearing" culottes that fall to the bottom of the knee, including any slits. No form-fitting clothing. Modest loose-fitting shirts and blouses only. No low cut shirts or blouses. No perforated or mesh-type shirts or blouses are acceptable. Only one-piece bathing suits underneath culottes and a dark-colored t-shirt will be allowed for swimming. No sun dresses, tank tops, sleeveless shirts, or cropped tops. No pants, gauchos, or shorts are permitted at any time. This includes while in the cabin and while sleeping. Appropriate casual dress clothes are required for evening services. Excess piercings and jewelry are not permitted.

GENTLEMEN'S CODE OF CONDUCT

The following types of clothing are NOT to be worn: see-through or mesh-like shirts, sleeveless shirts, sweatpants, oversized pants worn low on the hips, tight fitted clothing, modern or faddish style clothing. Jeans or casual pants ARE allowed. Pants are required to be worn at all services and for dinner each evening. Shorts are only allowed for swimming and physical activities. Shorts must be appropriate and must fall to the bottom of knee. Also, a dark colored t-shirt MUST be worn during all water related activities, such as swimming and canoeing. A collared shirt is required for dinner and evening services. Men will not be allowed to wear earrings, necklaces, or any piercing. Hair must be off the ears and collar, and no dyed or carved hair styles.

Any area of question will be determined by the camp director.
