## GENERAL INFORMATION

Families should bring their own bedding, towels, and toiletries (soaps, etc.). The cabins are bunk-style camp cabins. Some have their own private bathroom and shower, but many share a private bath house. Paper products are provided.

## BEDDING

Sleeping bags, sheets, blankets, and pillows will be needed. You can also bring an air mattress, if needed.

## SWIM CLOTHES

Weather and schedule permitting, there may be men's and ladies' swim times. There will also be a sign-up sheet for families to swim privately. We ask that all families follow the dress code in the camp code of conduct for swimming.

## EXTRAS

You can bring pool floats and toys, fishing rods, baseball gloves, lawn chairs, and highchairs or bumbo seats for the little ones at meals. You may want to bring snacks and drinks for between meals, but there will also be a snack shop open throughout the day that is run by the camp. Prices are reasonable. We will be bringing a first-aid kit, but you might want to bring band-aids, etc., just in case. Bring your favorite pastor-approved board game as well!

# FAMILY CAMP CODE OF CONDUCT

We are excited to be hosting our fourth Family Camp at the Promised Land Camp in Conestoga, Pennsylvania, from May 28-30, 2026, and we are thrilled that your family has chosen to attend. Our desire for this camp is for Christian families to spend time together as a family, have fellowship with and meet other like-minded families, and be strengthened in the faith while being challenged daily by God's Word.

Being a Christian camp, we strive to uphold biblical standards of conduct and dress. This printed code of conduct is designed to let you know what is expected of you and your family. If there is something that you are not willing to comply with, then we ask that you consider not attending the camp instead of putting us in a position to have to address an issue while at camp. There will be no hard feelings if you choose not to attend. If you have any questions about camp standards, please contact Pastor Moore.

## GENERAL INFORMATION

The camp standards are biblically based and will be upheld by all participants, of all ages, whether they be an attendee or a visitor. Following these rules while at the campground will help you to have a more enjoyable visit. Any violation of rules may result in being asked to leave camp prematurely with no refund. Please read them carefully.

## ALL PARTICIPANTS CODE OF CONDUCT

Participants are not to bring alcoholic beverages, narcotics, fireworks, tobacco in any form, pets, unauthorized guns, or other weapons of any kind. Clothing with questionable pictures, emblems, or slogans is also not allowed. Mixed swimming amongst non-immediate family members is prohibited. Immediate families will have the opportunity to have a family swim time, but the dress code (below) must be followed at all times.

Only adults (parents, grandparents, and staff) may have cell phones. No other electronics are permitted. No music is to be brought into the camp

in any form or by any means. Any games or board games that are brought to the camp must be approved by the pastor. No playing cards (cards that contain Ace, King, Queen, Jack, etc.) will be permitted. Card games such as Uno, Phase 10, and Dutch Blitz are permitted.

## LADIES' CODE OF CONDUCT

Ladies are required to wear modest skirts or “skirt-appearing” culottes that fall to the bottom of the knee, including any slits. The following types of clothing are NOT to be worn – pants, gauchos, shorts, sun dresses, tank tops, sleeveless shirts, or cropped tops. Basketball shorts and capris are not considered culottes and are not permitted. Blouses and shirts are to be loose fitting. Modest casual clothes are permitted for services. For swimming, only one-piece bathing suits will be worn, underneath culottes, along with a dark-colored t-shirt over top.

## GENTLEMEN'S CODE OF CONDUCT

The following types of clothing are NOT to be worn – see-through or mesh-like shirts, sleeveless shirts, cotton sweatpants, oversized pants worn low on the hips, or modern or faddish-style clothing. Jeans, casual pants, and knee-length shorts and cut-offs ARE allowed but must extend to the knee. Shirts must be worn at all times. For swimming, men will wear a knee-length bathing suit or knee-length shorts with a dark t-shirt. Men will not be allowed to wear earrings, necklaces, or any piercings. Hair must be off the ears and collar, and no dyed or carved hair styles.
